If you don't meet Curtin's minimum entry requirements, the UniReady Enabling Program can help you qualify for entry into some health, arts and creative industries, culture, language, education and business degrees.

This free program is designed to develop your independent learning skills and prepare you for university study. It lasts for one semester if you study full-time. See Curtin's academic calendar for exact dates (curtin.edu.au/academic-calendar) You must also be available during the examination weeks.

You can choose to study the program at Curtin's main campus or online – whatever is most convenient for you. You can even mix it up if you want to, and take some units online and other units in a class on campus.

The program is available to Australian and New Zealand citizens and Australian permanent residents. You must reside in Australia for at least one unit.

ABOUT THE UNIREADY ENABLING PROGRAM

IS THIS THE RIGHT PROGRAM FOR ME?

The UniReady Enabling Program is an excellent option if you:

- missed out on Curtin’s minimum ATAR, or
- completed year 12 but did not take WACE or equivalent exams, or
- did not successfully complete your high school studies, or
- have completed or are undertaking vocational studies and now want to begin university study, or
- are a mature-age student (over 20 years old).

Please note: You must be past the compulsory school age as defined by the Western Australian School Education Act 1999 in the year you wish to study the UniReady Enabling Program.

HOW WILL THIS PROGRAM HELP ME GET INTO CURTIN?

When you successfully complete the program, you will be able to apply for entry to certain undergraduate courses at Curtin. When you apply for an undergraduate course, a ‘notional’ ATAR will be calculated from your final grades from the UniReady Enabling Program. Your score is not considered an official ATAR because it is not awarded through TISC, but it is recognised by Curtin as meeting the University’s minimum entry requirements.

HOW DO I APPLY?

Please note, accepted applicants may be required to take a diagnostic test that will help determine unit selection within the program.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

The program is free, but you are expected to buy essential study materials such as stationery and a calculator, and have access to a reliable internet connection.

HOW DO I COMPLETE THE PROGRAM?

The duration of the UniReady Enabling Program is one semester full-time or two semesters part-time, with two intakes offered each year. The program comprises units to the value of 100 credits. There are two core units and four optional units. You complete two core units (worth 50 credits) and select optional units to the value of 50 credits.

You should choose optional units that relate to your preferred undergraduate course. For example, if you want to study a business degree, you should select the Introduction to Commerce unit as one of your options.

You must pass* all of your units to complete the program.
